Yalgado Hospital 's dedicated staff is here to serve you. Our departments include:

- Emergency: treats patients in life-threatening conditions.
- Ressuscitation: department dealing with reviving patients and returning them to consciousness by artificial respiration
- Pediatrics: provides healthcare from birth to teenage
- Obstetrics: cares for women through all stages of pregnancy
- Radiology: creates x-rays and CT scans for all departments
- Pathology: tests samples for all departments

- Surgery: treats diseases by operative procedure involving incision; repair damage or arrest disease; organ transplants.
- Dermatology: cares for skin and its diseases
- Nephrology: concerned with kidney and its disorders
- Neurology: deals with the nervous system and its disorders
- Infectious diseases: treats diseases transmitted only by specific kinds of contact
- Psychiatry: dealing with the diagnosis and treatment of mental disorders

- Internal medicine: this department deals with the diagnosis and treatment of systemic and auto immune diseases.

- Pulmonology: treats with respiratory diseases.

- Nuclear medicine: uses radioactive materials either to image a patient's body or to destroy diseased cells.

- Urology: deals with the diagnosis and treatment of disorders of the urinary tract or urogenital system.

- Traumatology: deals with the surgical repair of injuries and wounds arising from accidents.


